This book is a collection of essays revised from papers originally delivered at a conference at Mount Holyoke College, where the editor, Fred Moseley, is Associate Professor of Economics. As the dust jacket indicates, "The authors of the eight essays in this volume are evenly divided between philosophers and economists, reflecting the interdisciplinary nature of the subject of Marx's method in *Capital*". One guiding assumption of all the essays is that the prevailing interpretations of Marx's logical method are inadequate, in part because of the gap that has existed between philosophical and economic theory. In the main, either we have Marxian philosophers who discuss Marx's method without attention to the literature in economics, or economists who neglect the methodological issues in Marx; hence, the need for a book that "bridges the gap between these two fields of research by applying the insights gained from a philosophical examination of Marx's logical method to the ongoing controversies over his economic theory".

Fred Moseley's general introduction to the essays is indispensable for getting a sense of how the gap is bridged, for it might not be altogether clear on an independent reading how all of the essays converge. The first five essays focus on Marx's use of dialectical logic, while the last three are directed more to technical economic issues, eg, the relation of economic and property relations and the theory of prices of production. Moseley points out a number of methodological issues, heretofore unresolved and neglected, that are treated by the essays. Due to considerations of space, in view of the wide ranging nature of these issues, I will select three on which to focus this review: the meaning and significance of Marx's dialectical logic, the relation between essence and appearance, and the relation between Marx's method and that of Hegel.

The writers who address the issue of Marx's dialectical logic are in agreement in rejecting the "logical-historical interpretation" according to which the logical categories in *Capital* "correspond to an idealized periodization of the actual process of history" (p 1). On that view, the treatment in Volume 1, Part 1 of "simple commodity production" relates to precapitalist rather than capitalist production, thus providing an historical contrast as a way of leading into capitalism rather than beginning with capitalism itself from the very start. Apparently, this interpretation does not fit well with the idea, shared by the contributors, that
